Changing School Context

- Larger than average sized schools
- Biggest group is 'any other white background'
- Number of pupils who speak English as an additional language is well above national average- double the national average
- SEND is well above national average as pupils move into Ks2

Infants

1. Strong Leaders and Governors
2. Governors support and challenge well
3. Significant improvements in teaching and learning
4. Pupils' attitudes to learning are very positive
5. Behaviour is good
6. Educational visits contribute well to pupils' SMSC
7. Standards have improved
8. Good links with schools and community

Juniors

1. Staff, Leaders and Governors share the same ambition
2. Governors are skilled
3. Improvements in teaching and learning

Infant School

- Pupil presentation and handwriting

- Pupils must respond to teachers marking
- Clear expectations of lesson outcomes
- More demanding tasks to further stretch learning

From Good to Outstanding

- Focus on achieving more outstanding teaching and learning – take more risks
- Challenge for children at all levels
- Further enhance pupils ability to work independently and develop thinking skills
- Writing across the curriculum
- Consistently high expectations of pupils' work and behaviour for learning
- Maintain high levels of attainment and good/outstanding progress

Key School Priorities

1. Improve the quality of teaching and learning so that it is consistently good with more outstanding
2. Close the gap for those underattaining pupils in reading, writing and maths; whilst ensuring appropriate challenge for all learners
3. Embed an innovative and inspiring curriculum that is relevant and appropriate to the needs of our pupils and community
4. Ensure attainment in writing is above the national average and progress is consistent across the school

Focus this year

- Introduce the new National Curriculum
- Higher expectations in English and Maths (not current Y6)
- New assessment strategy for September 2015
- Spelling and grammar – closing the gap for those struggling to spell
- Embedding the Hazelwood curriculum drivers: awe and wonder, thinking skills, problem solving, creative arts, nurturing responsible citizens
