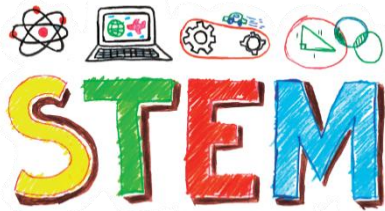

Trips & Experiences: STEM Workshop

Art: Fashion Design

In art this half term, the children will become fashion designers, inspired by their geography unit of North and South America. They will use colour, pattern, line, shape, form, material, texture to express their creativity and transform their own two-dimensional designs into three-dimensional ones, seeing how designers work to bring their own background, culture, passions and concerns into their fashion design.

Science: Living Things and their habitats

Year 5 will be able to describe the differences in life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird while also having the ability to describe the life process of reproduction in some animals and some plants. We will also look at how different animals and plants can be classified.

Our Vision and Values

Believe and Achieve

PSHE: Rights and Respect

We will look at understanding how issues of health are portrayed in the media before delving into volunteering, community and action groups and understanding the difference between responsibilities, rights and duties. After, the children will understand finances e.g. credit, interest, debt and loans.

Geography: North and South America

In Geography, children will be exploring how different people live in North and South America. They will be introduced to the concept of megacities, in particular looking at the megacities of Brazil. They will be exploring the push and pull factors that affect rural to urban migration in Brazil. Finally, they will be introduced to the concept of the Favela and challenging the stereotypes surrounding them.

RE: Why do some people think God exists?

The children will be continuing their RE unit this half term, pondering the existence of God and why some people do and don't believe in deities.

English:

Narrative

We will be translating the famous poem, 'The Highwayman' into a narrative, writing from the Highwayman's perspective as he rides into the town, converses with his love interest, Bess, and then rides off into the moonlight.

Newspaper Report

The children will continue to focus on 'The Highwayman' and will construct a report concerning the death of a character, which will include both direct and reported speech.

Reading:

Children will continue whole class reading and develop key reading skills using VIPERS.

Spelling:

Children will learn spelling patterns including *ie after c*, *ei making an /ee/ sound*, different *ough* spellings and how to use adverbs of possibility and frequency in their writing.

Maths:

Decimals and percentages: The children will look at up to three decimal places over the course of the half term, understanding the link between fractions, decimals & percentages and will be able to round decimals to the nearest whole and compare and order different decimal numbers.

Perimeter and Area: The children will look how to calculate the area & perimeter of different shapes, starting more simply with rectangles and rectilinear shapes before progressing to compound shapes and estimating area.

Spanish: La Clase - The Classroom

Children will learn Spanish vocabulary for classroom items and practise asking and answering questions about what they have (and do not have) in their pencil cases.

History: Norse Culture

In History, children will be learning about Norse culture. They will be learning about the Viking explorer Erik the Red, his daughter Freydis and son Leif. They will be exploring the fascinating world of Norse mythology and the stories of the Gods. They will look into the epic journeys that the Vikings took across the world. We will finish the unit by exploring the epic poem of Beowulf and discussing how this important piece of literature has impacted the world.

PE: Swimming (indoor)

We will be going swimming on a weekly basis this half term, with children being taught to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, using a range of strokes effectively and being taught to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Games: (outdoor)

The children will be learning map skills to navigate their way around our school grounds and they will be exploring our value of Teamwork while doing so.

Computing: Game Creator

Children will use 2DIY3D to create their own simple games, adding characters, collectables and clear instructions. They will think carefully about how to structure and place elements to support gameplay, and begin to customise their designs. Children will evaluate their own games and improve their work.

Music: The Planets

We will continue our learning about the opera Carmen by Bizet. We will also explore four pieces from The Planets Suite by Holst. We will consider different musical elements while listening to these pieces and think about the impact the composer wanted to have with his music.
