Trips and Experiences: HMS Belfast Visit, Growing & Changing Week, MyMe Transition workshop & leavers events

RE: What do religions say to us when life gets hard?

In RE, we will be sensitively learning about life after death from the perspective of different religions and worldview. We will explore the idea of the soul and the Hindu belief in reincarnation/Karma. Finally, children will learn about what might happen in a Christian funeral. *Please advise us if you feel this may be sensitive for your child.*

Music: Musicals & Choir

We will learn about the genre of Musical Theatre and study a Musical. We will learn some of the songs and practise our performing skills in preparation for our end of year production.

Spanish: Healthy Lifestyles

We will learn how to recognise, recall and spell ten healthy and unhealthy foods before using in sentences. They will also learn to speak about ways they keep fit.



PSHE: Keeping Safe

We will be looking the importance of emotional needs and why they are just as important as our physical needs as well as how to keep ourselves safe online and when using a mobile phone. In addition, we will also be looking at the risks of drugs and alcohol and how we can help other people choose to avoid these risks.

Growing and Changing

During growing and changing week we will be learning about online pressures, managing change and making babies.

Secondary Transition

Children will be prepared for their transition to secondary school through lessons and experiences throughout Summer 2.

D&T: Street Food & Production

Year 6 pupils explore street food from around the world, learning about cultural influences, nutrition, and food hygiene. They design and prepare their own dishes, developing cooking skills, creativity, and an understanding of healthy, balanced diets.

PE: Athletics

This term we will focus on a variety of running, jumping and throwing athletic activities. Pupils will be given opportunities to lead when officiating as well as observe and provide feedback to others.

Maths: Revision

Problem solving opportunities

Post SATs assessments children will have a variety of problem-solving opportunities applying their learning from the year

Money Ready Maths Workshops/Visits

Children will take part in engaging financial workshops designed to develop their awareness of money, budgeting, saving, and spending, helping them build confidence in making sensible financial decisions.

Geography:

Jamaica

In Geography, children will begin by exploring the migration story of a character called 'Orlene' before exploring how Jamaica is a diverse country. Children will then learn about hurricane Beryl and the impact this had before thinking about why tourists might choose to visit. Finally, children will reflect on how tourism impacts Jamaica and how it should be developed in the future.

Science: Light

Children will learn that light appears to travel in straight lines, understand that objects are seen because they reflect light into the eye and finally explore that shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

History: Black British History

Within this unit, pupils will explore the history and experiences of people of African and Caribbean heritage, beginning with African kingdoms and trade. They learn about the transatlantic slave trade and the journey from enslavement to freedom, then study influential individuals who shaped society. As part of this unit, children will also reflect on key historical events and remembrance. Finally, they learn about the Windrush generation and its lasting impact on modern Britain, promoting understanding of diversity, resilience and equality.

English:

Flashback Narrative – Alma

Children will be looking at the short film 'Alma' where they will be developing effective descriptions for both setting and character, whilst also developing techniques for suspense and vocabulary suitable for a horror genre.

Creative writing

Children will be encouraged to write creatively, applying all skills learnt throughout the year to a piece of narrative writing.

Computing: Coding

Children will develop their programming skills by designing and creating interactive projects using a range of coding tools and techniques. They will learn how to plan, test and debug programs, use variables and user input, and solve problems by breaking them into manageable steps. As their confidence grows, they will create more complex programs while developing logical thinking and creativity.
